



Discovery School's American-style curriculum meets high academic standards and engages students and their teachers in intellectual exploration that makes going to school exciting.

A warm and welcoming environment engenders a love of learning for our children.

Our classrooms and facilities are specially designed to create a space where innate curiosity is

fostered. Students strive for discoveries and reach for insights that will enhance their understanding of math, social sciences, history, art, science, and the art of communication. The many informal spaces allow the children to interact and have spontaneous activity throughout the day. The science curriculum integrates NGSS (21st Century Next Generation Science Standards) and STEM education (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math).

EARLY CHILDHOOD Nursery Through First grade

In these early years, every day is an opportunity for astounding growth. Your little one will thrive in our EC program that is a fun-filled learning experience.

Circle time is one of the most valuable times for teachers to give the instructions of the day. The children participate and learn to express themselves as well as listen to others.

Students will be engaged in their learning through working stations (art, language arts, math/science, STEM, and others). They will rotate to different centers every 10-12 minutes, keeping them active throughout the day. Teachers incorporate mini-topics into our curriculum; these are based on children's interests and their natural curiosity about the world around them.





Entry age: Nursery (age 3), Pre-K (age 4), Kinder (age 5), 1st grade (age 6).



Nursery and Pre-Kinder have a homeroom teacher and a bilingual assistant.



Special classes include French, Motricity, Music, and Spanish (K & 1st grade)



Focus on positive discipline, self-regulation, and practicing values.



From its inception, Discovery School has maintained a low student-to-teacher ratio, with a maximum of 17 students per class. Our class average ranges between 12-15 students per section.

Research has proven that small class sizes benefit students both academically and socially.

This can help teachers provide more attention to each student and be more sensitive to individual learning styles. In this environment, students are able to develop skills, knowledge, and build better friendship connections.





Our Education Team has experience working with children from all over the world.

All of the staff are qualified with at least a BA or BS degree. More than 60% of the teaching staff have earned a Master's Degree, and some of the teachers have more than one Master's Degree.

Discovery School is constantly providing opportunities for training with highly qualified consultants. Teachers teaching **AP classes** are trained by institutions sponsored by College Board.



ELEMENTARY Second grade to Fifth grade

We are committed to ensuring that our students become life-long learners and good citizens.

They expand their knowledge by providing diverse learning experiences that range from managing apps, practicing several sports, learning new musical instruments, and have social and environmental responsibility.

Early childhood and primary teachers (Kgrade 5) follow the guided reading program which helps build and strengthen students' literacy skills in phonics, vocabulary, and comprehension.

We aim to develop a well-rounded child that is well prepared for future years.



We focus on skill development and working collaboratively with other students.



Their technological and computer skills are broadened and deepened.



Special classes include French, Physical Education, Music, Spanish, Spanish Social Studies.



Lions Quest, our Social-Emotional Learning Program (SEL), will help to reinforce the positive attitudes and behaviors in students in these years.

We focus on the development of emotional intelligence, creative problem solving, conflict resolution, public speaking, life values, and interpersonal skills.

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SECONDARY Sixth grade to twelfth grade

This is an important transition for our students. They are now in the Secondary school that is divided into Middle School(MS) that goes from Sixth to Eighth grade, and High School (HS) that goes from Ninth to Twelfth grade.

We encourage students to pursue other areas of interest and assume a greater role in the leadership of the student body, leading sports teams, social clubs, and community initiatives.

Our goal is that our students will be well prepared for the university and equipped with the necessary skills, confidence, and character to succeed in life.



Co-curricular activities are a fundamental part of the Secondary. Many of the co-curricular activities involve sports, arts, music, science, and math competitions inside and outside the country.



The grading system changes in the Secondary. The GPA starts in High School (9th grade).

A range of Advanced Placement (AP) classes are offered for students from 10th grade to 12th grade. Students take college-level courses and gain credits for universities abroad. The APID (Advanced Placement International Diploma) is optional and the student must take at least 5 different AP courses.



The Secondary program is designated to provide a strong academic foundation since 100% of Discovery's graduating class pursue higher education in Honduras or abroad.

Our High School program (grades 9–12), which incorporates the Advanced Placement Program (AP) is university-preparatory. The academic program, including Pre-AP and AP courses, prepares students for entrance into competitive universities in the U.S. and throughout the world.

The school currently offers 8 AP courses: AP Environmental Science, AP Calculus AB, AP Human Geography, AP English Language and Composition, AP English Literature and Composition, AP Spanish Literature & Culture, AP Computer Science Principles, and AP Drawing. Other AP courses are offered in alternate years.

The final score for each AP Exam is reported on a 5-point scale that offers a recommendation about how qualified the student is to receive college credit and placement.





EXTRA-CURRICULAR Activities

Enrichment and sports-related activities support the well-being of our students. They can participate in diverse activities with other students that share their same interests.

Periodically standardized testing will be administered to the students, such as **PSAT**, **MAP**, **and AP Tests**.

Results are then used by the school to evaluate the curriculum, the learning program and to evaluate the academic progress of individual students.
